



Available in lengths up to 5.4m means entire walls can be covered without joins, creating a seamless finish. Paint to match your room decor or make a statement with colour to draw the eye to the wall panelling. This exciting new product is ideal for hallways, feature walls in living areas, bedrooms and entrance rooms where you want to create impact. The design works with any style – from modern contemporary to coastal beach home to an ultra-luxurious mansion.
